A MESSAGE FROM DANNY SOLOMON, DEAN OF STUDENTS AND CAMPUS OPERATIONS

As we emailed yesterday, we are proud to announce that students and staff performed well in our fire drill. Because the safety of any person in our care is our priority, we appreciate the time and effort staff and students put into these trainings and drills. As a reminder, staff will train and drill with students regularly for four types of drills: evacuations, reverse evacuations, hall checks, and lockdowns. The procedures, vocabulary, and partnership with first responders for these trainings and responses are standardized across Idaho thanks to a statewide partnership between first responders and schools, known as ISACARS: Idaho Standard Command Responses for Schools. Sage is proud to be a part of this collaboration focused on the safety of our students.

If you are curious about what these kinds of trainings entail, please check out the information hosted by the State Board of Education here. The videos embedded on the website are a part of staff and student trainings. Moving forward, you can expect monthly evacuation drills and 1-2 lockdown drills in a school year. Hall checks and reverse evacuation drills will also be conducted each year. Our lockdown drill for this year is scheduled for the week of January 30. The days may vary depending on the availability of partners in the Boise Police Department. It is important to note that parents also play a role in keeping a school safe. We appreciate all the conversations you have with your students regarding safety, and the reports you share with us about potential concerns. Another way parents help with safety is to keep the school grounds clear in the event of an emergency. While it is the most natural thing to want to be there for your child, schools need parents to avoid coming onto school grounds during an emergency so that first responders have room to maneuver their vehicles. This is especially important at Sage.

The Sage Community continues to demonstrate excellent comradery in the face of a less-than-best-case setting for our traffic. After auditing our traffic throughout the year, we are confident that we have arrived at the best traffic pattern given our campus and resources. As a reminder, we can continue to keep the flow of traffic moving by avoiding parking when dropping off or picking up students, ensuring students have jackets and other necessities donned and ready to go when they are dropped off, always following the prescribed routes, zipper merging with buses and other drivers, using turning signals, and following the directions from staff on the ground. Your patience and safe practices are appreciated every single day.

PYP WITH DIRECTOR KATE HUNTER

What is the PYP?

One thing we LOVE about the PYP framework is that it encourages play. Children (and adults, too!) engage in their environments, solve problems, and make meaning through play. While it is easy



to fall into the trap of separating play from academic learning, the IB has created a manual for us that highlights the many benefits of play and helps us understand, as educators and parents, how to make play especially meaningful and joyful. Take a look at the IB's resource on Inquiry through Play for some practical tips and tricks.

Classroom (Teacher) Spotlight:

Speaking of play – we want to highlight the importance of meaningful staff play and the deep sense of collegiality we have at Sage. The ever-growing body of educational



research tells us that collective teacher efficacy – essentially the belief that teachers can and will, together as a team, create lasting change for students – is a key factor in the health of a school and the growth of individual students. In order for us to maintain collective teacher efficacy, we need strong teacher teams that trust each other and leverage one another's strengths. We also need

teams that know how to play and laugh together! Pictured here you can find our 1st grade team, taking a playful stance against glitter in their classrooms (they want to make it clear that they encourage sparkle – just not glitter!).
