A NOTE FROM HEAD OF SCHOOL, DARCI STELZNER

Happy New Year! We know that children learn better and faster when teachers have a clear picture of what students know and how they are growing academically. To ensure we are meeting your child's academic needs, we utilize the Measure of Academic



Progress (MAP) Growth Assessment three times per year. The winter benchmark for MAP will begin January 11 (full schedule below).

The MAP Growth is a computer-adaptive test. If your child answers a question correctly, the next question is more challenging. If they answer incorrectly, the next one is easier. This type of assessment challenges top performers without overwhelming students whose skills are below grade level. The MAP Growth uses an RIT scale to accurately measure what students know and measures growth over time. This helps you track your child's progress throughout the school year and across multiple years. We will take the MAP growth again in May.

To help your child do their very best, our teachers are working with them on testtaking strategies and skills. A healthy breakfast with protein and a good night's sleep before the assessments will be incredibly helpful!

Re-enrollment for the 2023-24 school year begins January 30th and parents will have through **February 12th** to complete it to reserve their student's spot for next year. Be on the lookout for an email from our registrar Arin on January 27th.

During re-enrollment, you will also have the opportunity to apply for the sibling lottery for any additional students that don't already attend Sage but that you would like to enroll for next year. LIFE IN THE PYP WITH COORDINATOR NORA STRAUCH


Taking action is an important part of the learning process. This is what the I.B. says about action: "Students taking action in response to their inquiries lays a foundation for community service in [the future]. Action is a means for students to show that they have linked their learning to real-life issues and opportunities."

We teach our students that there are many different ways to take action. Some of the main ways to take action are:

- to inform others
- to change one's own behavior and choices
- to inspire others to change their behavior and choices
- to help prevent a problem
- to build something
- to design a solution

Some of our younger PYP learners in Grade 1 and Grade 2, have been taking action as a result of the new knowledge and understanding they gained in their current inquiries.

Grade 2 students are finishing an inquiry into citizenship. Using what they learned about the characteristics of good citizens in a community, they combined their research and creativity to create posters of both historical and current good citizens. They will be displaying them in the hall to inform others.







Our Grade 1 students have been learning about resources and our responsibility to help make resources last. They are taking action by doing trash clean-ups around school and sorting the items into: trash, recyclables, or reusables. It is amazing to watch



our students connect their learning with real-life problems and solutions.

MYP Students are finishing up their first semester strong! We will begin MAP testing this week with Math. Next week, we'll complete the Reading portion of the MAP test. Parents, please make sure students are coming to school rested and well-fed, with charged Chromebooks, planners, and all other needed supplies. Are you checking and signing their planners each evening? Are you also checking into their assessments in Toddle? These are some of our best methods of communicating our daily must-dos with you. We are looking forward to seeing them show what they know on MAP testing and going into our second semester!


A NOTE FROM NURSE BLEW:


I would love donations of snacks that kids like, especially small packages of crackers and granola bars. I get a lot of visits from kids that don't have snacks from home, or that get tummy aches
