Dear Parents and Staff of Sage International Schools,

We appreciate your support and confidence in our schools. This is an important time of the year for public charter schools in Idaho. FROM OUR SCHOOL COUNSELORS:

National School Counseling Week is held the first week of February and focuses on advocating the unique contributions school counselors have within the school community. This highlights school counselors' tremendous impact in helping students achieve school success, supporting their mental health, and assisting them with college and career readiness.

As mental health professionals, we provide students the opportunity to participate in brief individual check-in counseling sessions and group counseling. We also provide emergent responsive services for students who are struggling with their mental health or are in a mental health crisis. As education professionals, we participate in the intervention process and collaborate with teachers, support staff, directors, and parents in order to help students succeed to their fullest potential. Additionally, school counselors at Sage are the 504 coordinators for their respective grade levels, provide classroom social-emotional learning lessons, ensure students are fulfilling Idaho requirements for graduation, and provide college and career guidance. You can frequently find us on the playground or in the lunchroom, supporting administration, and working 1:1 with students on campus.

This is just a glimpse into the services that a school counselor provides daily. The role

of a school counselor varies school by school and by grade level. If you have any questions for your school counselors or if your child is struggling with anything, please reach out! THE PYP WITH KATE HUNTER

Classroom Spotlight, Fourth Grade:

Students recently wrapped up their inquiry unit on the PYP theme "How We Organize Ourselves", focusing on the central idea that the choices communities and organizations make influence each other.



Students learned about economics and the use of bartering systems prior to the emergence of monetary systems. For Bartering Day, students brought in items they felt were important, but that they were willing to trade for an even better item. They worked to try and convince each other why their item was valuable and why someone should trade them. After the activity, students wrote reflections about what went well, if they were happy with their trade, and why they think we moved away from a bartering system into a monetary one.







Recently, **3rd graders** dissected owl pellets, with the assistance of Mr. Mercer's 11th grade science students! They removed any bones they







found and then classified what animal they came from and what part of the body. Skulls were especially exciting. As one student said, "it may sound gross, but it's FUN!"









2nd grade students had a wonderful time visiting The <u>James Castle House</u> last week. This fits into their unit's driving question of "How do humans use creativity to express themselves?" They've been been busy creating works in the style of James Castle!

MIDDLE SCHOOL WITH ZACH PARKER

This month we highlight our 8th-grade class! Cari Woodruff, our 8th-grade Physical and Health Educator, brought in two guest speakers over the past four class periods. First, a member of 4-H engaged our



students in the study of animal adaptation in the winter, identifying animal tracks and understanding migration as well as introducing students to the use of maps and compasses. Second, a Hydrologist from the Boise Watershed worked with students to understand the various aspects of snow and the importance of snowpack (the accumulation of snow) in our surrounding mountains.

The culmination of these past two weeks resulted in 8th-grade students having the opportunity to snowshoe at Bogus Basin Ski Lodge. Students were broken into small groups and traversed the mountainside looking for animal tracks, sliding into igloos,

digging snow pits, and measuring various temperatures to analyze the insulating factors that snow can provide.

This is the third year Mrs. Woodruff has provided this great experience.









Congratulations to some talented 8th-grade Sage writers! In November, Rosalie Harris, Maecy Page, and Brooke Reese completed <u>NaNoWriMo</u>, a national novel writing challenge to complete an original novel of 50,000 words in one month. These students may now edit and publish their finished novels! Equally impressive, two students entered



their creative writing into Idaho's Scholastic Writing competition. Both Ishi Bolleddu and Elizabeth Wiegley earned a Gold Key award, which is the highest honor. They are automatically entered into the national competition to take place in March.
