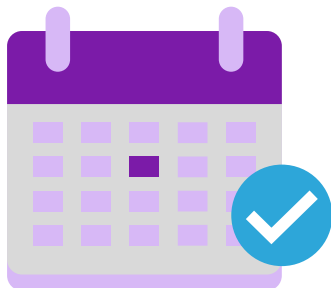

Dear parents and staff of Sage International Schools,

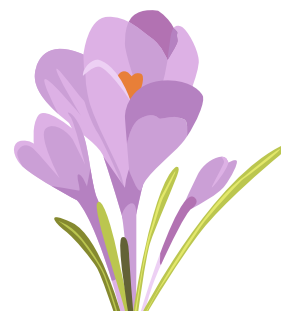

They will join just as our very first class of kindergarteners is finishing their IB coursework in preparation for exams and graduation in May.

- ~Provide opportunities for your child to make their own decisions, discuss the consequences of their decisions.
- ~ Read and tell stories in which the story characters demonstrate making principled decisions
- ~ Discuss how being principled is life long commitment and well sought after as a characteristic to have.

The PYP classes are moving into their next Units of Inquiry for this school year. Our inquiry time in the classroom is also a great time for students to practice being Principled by showing integrity, respect and responsibility while learning and working in a group.



Here are the new units for our PYP students:

Kinder - How We Organize Ourselves: Communities provide resources

Grade 1 - Where We Are In Place and Time: Cultures grow and change through time

Grade 2 - How We Express Ourselves: Creative thinking can lead to innovation

Grade 3 - How The World Works: The natural world follows laws and predictable patterns

Grade 4 - (combined) How We Organize Ourselves and How We Express Ourselves

Grade 5 - Sharing the Planet / PYP Exhibition

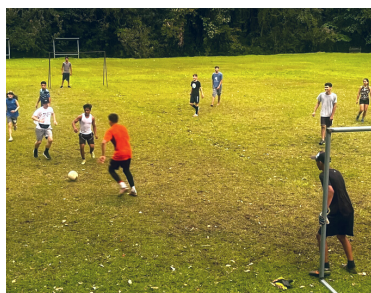

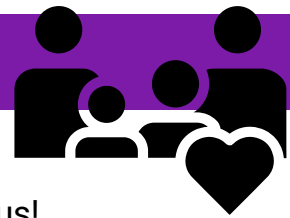


FORGE EXPEDITIONS IN COSTA RICA!

Expeditions Leader Megan Furois, Head of School Darci Stelzner, and 4 parent chaperones spent 6 days over winter break in Costa Rica with 10 students in grades 6-8. These students showed incredible IB attributes all week long! They were **risk-takers** by snorkeling, zip lining, and hiking in new places. Students were **caring** and **principled** while learning about sustainability and experiencing a new culture. They were **knowledgeable** using their Spanish skills to talk to new people and make new friends. They even played soccer with local kids! They were **open-minded** trying new things and new foods while asking questions and being eager to learn. They visited thermal hot springs and experienced the culture through cooking classes and local farm tours. They visited Rincon de la Vieja national park and Cano Negro national park, and the Arenal volcano/ La Fortuna waterfall. They hiked, swam in the ocean and rivers, and took a boat tour. On that tour they saw 3 kinds of monkeys, sloths, toucans, countless birds, caymans, crocodiles, iguanas, lizards of all sorts, and so much more. ¡Qué bueno!
