FROM EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, ANDY JOHNSON

Dear parents and staff,

We have arrived at Fall break! It has been an incredible start to the year - lots of strong teaching, deep learning and many, many opportunities for parents, students and teachers to connect. A



Sage school experience starts as soon as you walk into one of our school buildings and meet our front desk teams of Robyn, Cassie, Sarah and Natalie at the Boise campus and Jessica, Arin, Amanda and Lorinda at the Middleton campus. They are always sunny, friendly and tirelessly caring toward your children. I am incredibly grateful to each of them.

Governor Little visited Sage Boise last week. He wanted to visit a local Boise high school so that he could talk to the Seniors about <u>Idaho Launch</u>. Idaho Launch was one of the Governor's priorities during the last legislative session. It is a program that provides up to \$8,000 to students over two years for post-secondary education or training for in-demand careers. A few of the fields Governor Little described included those in health care, the trades, IT, the nuclear/atomic industry and other similar fields.

As schools that are intended to be college preparatory experiences, I encourage families of 9th and 10th Graders to talk to their children about the IB's <u>Diploma Programme (DP)</u>. We just submitted our DP application this week and really look forward to the growth of our high school at Sage Middleton. All of the learning and growth experiences through the Primary Years Programme (PYP) and Middle Years Programme (MYP) will ensure that a majority of children are ready to successfully complete the Diploma Programme in 12th grade.

Finally, I hope that you all enjoy the length of our breaks and long weekends. These are intentional and designed to be different than the norm. We believe that a longer day over a shorter week interspersed with regular breaks is good for well-being, learning consolidation and importantly, allows for unhurried, lower-stress teacher collaboration. For older students, it allows time to work on longer pieces of work such as the Personal Project, Extended Essay, student-designed inquiry and research projects, the Reflective Project, Service as Action and participate in physical activity. Also and very importantly, when teachers and school leaders have time to engage in collaborative and purposeful work together, outcomes for students improve. Thank you for supporting our approach! We believe it is good for children and good for adults. Enjoy the break and we will see you in October!

Hello! The learner profile of the month for October is **Thinker**. We use critical and creative thinking skills to analyze and take responsible action on complex problems. We exercise initiative in making reasoned, ethical decisions. With this learner profile attribute we show creativity and think of different ways to solve problems.



How can parents help to develop students who are thinkers at home?

- 1. Encourage your child to engage in pretend play; children are naturally curious and imaginative.
- 2. Pause and wait...give your child time to think for him/herself, be patient.
- 3. Don't intervene immediately, it's okay to let your child explore on their own.
- 4. Ask open-ended questions.
- 5. Help children develop hypotheses.
- 6. Encourage critical thinking in new and different ways.
- 7. Encourage your child to retell stories, put on plays with story props.
- 8. Leave time for unstructured play.
- 9. Encourage your child to play and explore outside.
- 10. Encourage Creative Thinking.
- 11. Let your child experience failure, and then let him/her figure out how to turn their failure into a positive learning experience.
- 12. Provide opportunities to visit Children's Museums and Libraries.



Hello parents! Cold and Flu season is fast approaching. Please see the Sage 2023-2024 Parent/Student Handbook for guidance on when to keep sick kids home from school. A very basic guideline is that students must be free of vomiting, diarrhea, and/or fever over 100 degrees for



24 hours in order to return. There may be exceptions for chronic health issues causing vomiting or diarrhea. I can help assess if your student starts feeling ill at school and needs to go home, and appreciate a heads-up if you have information to share that may help me do so. Sage follows <u>CDC guidelines</u> regarding COVID-19 infections. The CDC is currently advising isolation at home for 5 days (longer with significant symptoms) and then masking for 5 days.

It is important for kids to attend school every day as long as they feel well enough and are not contagious. Thank you for your help keeping our students and staff safe and healthy!
