Sage International School engages students within an inclusive international learning community, challenging all members to take risks and contribute locally and globally through open-minded inquiry. Dear Sage families and staff,

October was lovely and gave us wonderful opportunities to extend our Summer-like outdoor activities. However rainy, blustery autumn weather seems to have finally arrived. With the arrival of colder and

more variable weather, please ensure that you are all taking the right steps to stay healthy - jackets for outside play, good handwashing, staying home if you have a fever, staying up-to-date on vaccinations and getting lots of fresh air and exercise. We want all of our teachers, support staff and students to be in school for the most days possible because the evidence shows that being present, even when we aren't at 100%, is far better for teaching, learning and improved academic outcomes.

At the risk of stealing Darci's thunder, I want to make sure you all know that we are moving forward with our plans to become (in alignment with our chartering documents) a fully accredited International Baccalaureate school. We are authorized to offer the Primary Years Programme (PYP) in Grades K-5, we are a candidate school for the Middle Years Programme (MYP) in Grades 6-10 and our application to become a candidate school for the Diploma Programme (DP) was accepted. We are moving forward to do the work to ensure we have all three programmes in place at our school. We are well underway in our project to build the second phase of our campus - the high school building. We are wrapping up financing and expect to begin construction after the new year with an opening date of late July 2024. Part of this construction project includes adding grass and fencing. This will dramatically increase the outdoor play and learning spaces on campus. The building itself will house the all-school media center and an intentionally designed science lab-teaching space. Our goal is to have a building that is as flexible and student-centered as possible. It will incorporate features that are in the existing buildings such as garage doors between classrooms and in the case of the science space, a garage door opening into the wider-than-phase-one hallways. We are excited about this and hope you are as well.

As a school chartered to be college preparatory by design, I want to make sure I regularly touch base with all of you about the importance of thinking, planning and preparing well before 11th and 12th Grade. This <u>blog\_post from UNCF</u> is a straightforward and effective set of advice and activities for each of the high school years. It mentions a resource that I've shared before - <u>Big Future</u> from the College Board. Please sign up for this now and start having conversations with your 8th through 12th-grade students about post-high school plans. <u>Next Steps Idaho</u> is

## FROM HEAD OF SCHOOL, DARCI STELZNER

The learner profile attribute we will focus on during the month of November is **Knowledgeable**. Knowledgeable learners explore concepts, ideas and issues that have local and global significance. In doing so, they acquire in-depth knowledge and develop understanding across a broad and balanced range of disciplines. IB students are extraordinarily well prepared for the academic requirements of university coursework.



How can parents help to develop students who are knowledgeable at home?

- Encourage your child to be aware of current events by watching the news or reading news articles when appropriate.
- Explore connections between the area of interest and other topics.
- When your child asks a question, encourage them to seek the answer out rather than giving them the answer.
- Ask your child about what they are learning in school and engage them in conversations about it.
- Foster areas of interest that your child displays through books, outings and activities.

#### Ask:

- "Why do you think that is important to know?"
- "Can you think of anything that's happening today that might be similar to...?"
- "What does that make you think of?"
- "Does that remind you of anything else you've learned?"

Regular attendance is critically important for learning and success at school. National studies show that a middle schooler who misses two (2) or fewer days of school each year has a 93% chance of starting high school on track to graduate, versus 66% for a child who misses 10 or more days. As a K-10 school, we are sitting at about 93% attendance. We appreciate your support in ensuring students are at school as much as possible!

Hello Sage Middleton Families,

The past month has been filled with great opportunities to hit a stride with learning and build connections. Last week was a wonderful Spirit Week to add a little extra joy to our days. It was great fun to see all the students dressing up for the various days

and building a little extra excitement for the week. We also appreciated the time families took to come and conference with their teachers. This is a way for the team to connect and make plans to support the students moving forward through the year. Thank you for making that time!

The Grade 4 students marked the end of their unit of inquiry under the theme, How We Express Ourselves by hosting a poetry cafe. The students inquired into the structures of poetry, the themes of poems and stories, and personal inspiration. Each student chose one of their published poems to read aloud to an audience of classmates, families and other teachers. It was such a fun event and we are so proud of the students' work!

We are seeing positive trajectories in our Istation reading assessments each month! This is the program we use for kindergarten through third grade to measure their reading proficiency through the state. This is a credit to the hard work the team puts in each day to support our students. We also know that support at home happens as well and we appreciate your partnership in your student's learning. Simple acts such as reading a book, discussing the meaning of words, or playing math games can go a long way in supporting your students' learning. We always love to provide specific examples of things families can do to support from home, so please reach out if you would like ideas.

Part of that growth comes from students being in the classroom and learning every day. Regular attendance is an important factor in student learning. We understand that we can't always plan for illness or other events, and we appreciate all that you do to get your students here each day. We love having them here and are excited to continue having a wonderful school year with them participating.


