## FROM EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, ANDY JOHNSON



Dear Families and Staff,

Welcome back to the start of the second semester and to 2024. It is at this time of year in IB schools that we really start to think about and focus on all the work our Diploma Programme and Career-related Programme students (11th and 12th Grades) are preparing and submitting. Students who engage in the full experience of either of these two programs are more prepared for post-secondary studies and careers than students who do not.

This month the <u>Charter School Growth Fund</u> (CSGF) released a report on a study they did of post-secondary outcomes for students who graduated from CSGF affiliated schools. The results were very interesting and caused me to reflect on the ways we prepare our students for post-secondary life. Students in the report identified three things they wish they had more of in high school: a. Career guidance and planning while in high school. b. Making a clear choice about a post-secondary pathway (an actual plan for the day following graduation) and c. advice on what to expect after high school.

I feel strongly that students in Sage schools who are pursuing the full Diploma Programme or the Career-related Programme get much of those three elements as a natural part of their participation in either program. They get exponentially more when they + their parents meet with and discuss post-secondary options with our counselor.

Finally, I want to make sure that all of our parents know that students graduating from Sage schools can potentially graduate with four different credentials - an Idaho high school diploma, a Diploma Programme Diploma/Career-related Certificate, a STEM diploma and a Seal of Biliteracy. Please look for upcoming opportunities to learn more and/or reach out to your student's principal to be connected to a person who can answer specific questions you may have about our school and how we make a difference in children's futures.

We are excited to announce the introduction of a new certification that your graduating student can earn at Sage - the <u>Seal of Biliteracy</u>. This prestigious award recognizes students' academic proficiency in both English and a second language. One path to demonstrating proficiency is by taking and passing the Language B French (or Spanish in Middleton) examination during the IB exam session in May of the Senior year. There are other ways to demonstrate proficiency to earn this award, and we will be sharing more information soon.

### Winter Conferences February 1st and 2nd

We hold winter parent-teacher conferences specifically for students that are receiving some kind of additional support in reading,

mathematics, or another aspect of student life. Teachers will reach out to you directly with an invitation to attend <u>if</u> this applies to your student (and if we have not already met recently or have a plan to do so soon). Of course, we welcome – and need! – a strong home-school connection for all students, so please do not hesitate to reach out to us about your child at any time. We can certainly schedule meetings or calls as needed at any time.

### **Report Cards**

Report cards are now available for your review in Skyward. These are a broad snapshot into overall progress. If you have any questions about your child's progress, please reach out to his/her teacher and rest assured that we will contact you as well if we have any concerns.

### Winter Assessments

We are in the midst of our winter assessments, including <u>MAP</u>. MAP allows us to take note of both individual growth AND achievement toward grade level proficiency. This is one of many tools we use to gauge progress and adjust accordingly. As we did in the fall, we will send this information home for your review.

### **Classroom Spotlight: K-1 Performing Arts**

In Kindergarten and First Grade Performing Arts we have been working on movement! We are currently learning the eight Laban Efforts and exploring how movement can help us create characters. For example what kind of character might move using 'glide', perhaps an ice skater or a bird! We then experiment with how we can use our bodies to become such characters, we can use our arms to change the shape of our bodies, change our voice or make a silly face. Then we can use our imagination to change our environment. We can imagine what it might feel like to be a bird in the sky with wind whistling through our feathers, or an ice skater doing twirls in a cold rink. By expanding our imaginations and exploring new types of movement we can do anything!
