SEAL OF BILITERACY

Sage is pleased to announce that we will be awarding the network's first Seals of Biliteracy to members of this year's graduating class. The Seal of Biliteracy, adopted by the Idaho Legislature in Spring 2020, gives official recognition on high school transcripts to graduating seniors who have achieved a high level of proficiency in English plus additional languages, including home languages.

This spring students were offered the opportunity to take the STAMP test (STAndards-based Measurement of Proficiency) in order to qualify for the Seal. We are proud to announce the following students achieved Seal of Biliteracy level scores:
