FROM EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, ANDY JOHNSON

Dear Families and Staff of Sage International Schools,

Welcome back to school! I hope that you enjoyed your September break goofing off in the outdoors, reading books, playing and all the other things families do when they have time to relax together.



We are at that point in the year when we are ready to really lean into learning. The first few weeks of school are obviously filled with learning, but it is also a time of cementing routines, establishing positive relationships and figuring out "how to be at school." These are all critical elements of a successful start to the school year.

This period of time from October through December is when teachers increase expectations around learning. We ask students to craft strong pieces of writing; to emphasize good spelling, punctuation and grammar; to deepen their skill with mathematics; to parle un peu de français or habla un poco de espanol; and to see themselves as researchers in the natural and social sciences.

Helping your child become a strong reader is one of the surest paths to success in school. Reading opens up worlds to people and it is the primary way children can rapidly build their knowledge and understanding of the world. Encourage your child(ren) to read and do mathematics at home - especially on Fridays. If your child is still young - read to and with them. Visit the library regularly with your child(ren) and help them find books you can all love and enjoy. Finally, one of the best ways to make sure your child grows as a learner is to ensure they come to school on time, everyday. Regular and routine attendance is a strong predictor of individual success. It is important to be at school throughout the school year, but especially critical as we get into the spring months (I know that feels like a long way off). For a variety of reasons the months of March and May are times when student absences go way up. Please make sure your child(ren) are coming to school all year.

We are excited to learn and grow with you and your children. Thank you for your trust and support. We have great schools for our communities and families.

MIDDLE SCHOOL DIRECTOR, ZACH PARKER

8th Grade Adventure: Three days prior to Fall Break a handful of Sage staff took 85 of our 8th graders to Ketchum. This is our 3rd Annual of such a trip. The purpose has always been to bring students together through placing them in an unfamiliar environment as well as getting them to think and reflect on the experiences they are placed in. It is



really a great opportunity for students to lean into and embrace Sage's mission statement and various IB attributes.

This year students had the opportunity to work with the <u>Wood River Trails Coalition</u> to help clear overgrown trails and repair trailheads. Additionally, students learned from the Forest Service about tree growth and harvesting, animal identification and the history of early conservation pioneers. Free time was spent playing outside on the volleyball court and in the gaga ball pit. There was no lack of rain, which was a favorite part for many 8th graders!







Math Support: I want to circle back to a previous message I sent out last month regarding the use of Imagine Math. Imagine Math is used during the school week and is also available, and and recommended, for use at home. All students have access to this and can log in at home. HERE is a tutorial that Mrs. Harry, 6th grade Math teacher, put together to support families. I strongly recommend setting aside protected time on Friday, or sometime over the weekend, to have your student practice for at least 30 minutes. Imagine Math provides dynamic individual practice on those math skills which your student needs - as well as providing challenge in areas of strength. Our use of Imagine Math (and hopefully the use you encourage at home) is part of our effort to help all of our students become stronger and more successful mathematicians.

Toddle Support: As we all continue to develop our skills and communication with the Toddle App, I want to provide <u>this support page</u> to help you make adjustments within the settings. Among several aspects, this will show you how to adjust your notifications, language options and, if need be, toggle between multiple students. Additionally, it will define certain terms to help you navigate and find what you need.

Sources of Strength: Our October focus is **Positive Friends**. Talk with your students about what makes a positive friend. Who are their positive friends and why?

Harvest Dance: We will have our fall dance here at Sage from 6:30 -8:30 on October 10th. Tickets will be sold during lunch that week and available at the door for \$5.

11th-Grade DP ART with Karelia Dubkowski: In September students were treated to a visiting artist workshop with mixed-media collage artist **Meghan Kahnle**. Meghan focuses on art connected with storytelling, community and collaboration. Her multifaceted process





deals with collage, layering and experimenting with texture. In this 2- day workshop, students worked alongside her to learn some of the techniques she incorporates into her process. Following the workshop, students were asked to create a critical investigation and documentation of the workshop that will lead into an independent artwork inspired by some aspect of the artist's technique, process and themes. This will connect to the DP Visual Arts components for testing requirements involving studying artists to inform their own work.
