Playground Equipment Update-


We are excited about the new playground equipment! This new addition will give students additional opportunities for physical activity, imaginative play, and strengthened social connections during recess.



In the PYP, play is recognized as a powerful driver of inquiry. Through play, children explore ideas, negotiate roles, experiment with problem-solving, and build the social and self-management skills that help them thrive as learners. To facilitate this, we use

research-based approaches to playground procedures, such as zoning the playground for different activities, providing students a way to play and have fun with a universal conflict-resolution tool, and providing a stepped approach to responding to behaviors.

This approach aligns well with the IB and child-development research. We use a combination of the following to create a playground that is fun, safe, active, and developmentally supportive. These playground routines also help to maximize learning time in the classroom.



IB PYP Learner Profile: Our playground routines help students practice key attributes such as Caring (taking turns and including others), Principled (following playground agreements and respecting shared space), and Balanced (engaging in healthy physical activity and using calm areas when needed). They are also Communicators (using simple tools like Rock-Paper-Scissors to solve disagreements quickly), and Thinkers (making choices, solving problems independently, and learning from natural consequences).

We also use <u>Peaceful Playgrounds</u> to establish clear play areas, reduce conflicts, and improve safety. Structured options lead to more active play for all students, and Playground Behavior Training teaches simple conflict-resolution routines. The <u>Let Grow Philosophy</u> encourages giving children appropriate independence so they can build resilience, confidence, and problem-solving skills. Our approach allows kids to handle small problems themselves, giving them freedom to make decisions within clear boundaries.

PYP STEM NIGHT: This great event hosted by Sage High School students has been rescheduled! Please mark your calendar for **Thursday, December 4**th **from 5:30 - 7:00 here at Sage**. We hope your family can join us for STEM-based activities for your students in K-5 including booths, exciting robotics, and a scavenger hunt!

2nd **Grade held a Harvest Celebration** on Thursday as the culmination of their unit of inquiry on how living things depend on one another to meet their needs and maintain balance in the environment. All three classes read the story *Stone Soup* and made soup together with vegetables that they brought from home to share.







That afternoon, their families joined them with pots of their favorite soups and bread to enjoy a meal together. It was a wonderful celebration of friendship and food!

MIDDLE SCHOOL (6-8) WITH ZACH PARKER

From an **academic standpoint**, I would like families to know that all Semester 1 finals will be taking place during December. You can expect an uptick in school work, hopefully a strong focus on your students' part, and likely some stress. I encourage you to help your student create a structured study plan at home that is balanced and consistent.



For example, when students get home from school, they may need some time to decompress. Then they may need a schedule for completing their tasks, such as completing any household chores, listening to music, and getting some physical activity in. Also scheduled in there should be a set time to complete school work (see the WAAGs) before getting good, solid sleep. As always, I encourage NO PHONES in your students' bedrooms to avoid late-night texting.

On a **cultural level**, Middle School Student Council put together a fun Christmas Movie Contest that students get to vote on in December. This is fully optional, and it provides a great opportunity for students and families to have dialogue and debate on the best Christmas movie when they go head-to-head. As Communicators, we express ourselves confidently and creatively in more than one language and in many ways. We collaborate effectively, listening carefully to the perspectives of other individuals and groups.



Our student selected IB Communicator of the month is Mr. Fraley! Mr. Fraley teaches French to our 11th and 12th graders and has recently taken on the role of K-12 French Department Lead. He was nominated for this award by several students and here is some of what they had to say: Junior Greta Hall shared, "He always tries to make sure everyone is learning and that everyone is able to absorb some sort of information in his class. He enjoys helping his students and listening to them. He also asks for feedback about his teaching and how he can

improve." Junior Urban Salmans commented, "Mr. Fraley goes through great effort to communicate deadlines and upcoming events to us. Also he teaches us how to communicate in a different language and that requires a lot of communication skills." Nov 11th was a very special day for Sage's 21 DP Seniors! They just turned in their IB Extended Essay, a 4,000-word academic research paper on a topic of their choice that they've been developing for the past sixteen months! Starting in their junior year, each student selected a subject, formed a research question, and spent the year researching, drafting,

and revising. The Extended Essay is a major DP requirement that asks students to manage their time, work independently, and build strong research and writing skills. Through this process, each student produced a substantial piece of academic work they can be proud of. We're so proud to see them make it to the finish line!

CP Update and Celebrations: Year 1 CP students are working hard in their individual career-related study tracks. Scout has taken students out to experience several opportunities for learning in their field, and she recently hosted many community members for panel discussions related to students' career interests. I want to send a HUGE thank you to everyone who showed up to support our students in their knowledge and future career pursuits. You are all making a difference in their lives.
